Background:

Cities are dynamic and complex entities that serve as economic, cultural, and social hubs, offering opportunities for growth, development, and innovation, but they also confront a host of pressing challenges in a rapidly urbanizing world. As urban populations swell, cities continue to grapple with issues like congestion, pollution, housing shortages, and equitable access to resources. Mayors, as leaders at the local level, play a pivotal role in shaping urban landscapes, implementing sustainable policies, and fostering community engagement.

Historically, mayoral positions have been predominantly occupied by men, reflecting broader gender disparities in leadership roles. While women constitute over half of the global population, their representation in leadership positions of the world's cities is merely 5%. [1]

The event "Woman and Mayor: A Gender Perspective on Challenges and Visions for Cities" aims to shed light on the underrepresented perspectives of women in city leadership roles and their unique contributions to urban governance. The event seeks to explore the ways in which gender-balanced leadership enhances decision-making, promotes inclusivity, and contributes to more effective urban management, leading to safer, as well as more accessible and sustainable cities. Through a roundtable discussion, women leaders will bring their perspectives and experiences on how gender-sensitive leadership can lead to innovative solutions for urban challenges such as gender-based violence, access to education and healthcare, and sustainable urban planning.

[1] UCLG approximates that approximately 20% of council members and a mere 5% of mayors worldwide are women. Nonetheless, there is presently a scarcity of consistent global data concerning the female presence in local councils.
