

## 3<sup>RD</sup> URBAN PEACE DIALOGUES

For the third consecutive year, the City Diplomacy Lab is working to bring cities' peace advocacy and engagement to the UNECE Forum of Mayors.

# Concept note

September 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2024

#### **BACKGROUND**

Since World War II, cities have become the central scene of all kinds of armed violence, witnessing most of the loss of life and destruction. It is unsurprising that elected officials from some of the most concerned cities gradually emerged as vocal advocates for peace.

The 2024 edition of the Urban Peace Dialogues aims to convene mayors and representatives of so-called "cities of remembrance" to the Forum of Mayors. The proposed event consists of a moderated discussion to facilitate the panelists' formulation of a clear, consistent, and united message for peace. Thus, they will be invited to discuss not only the destructive impact of armed violence their cities suffered but also the constructive impact of resilience, reconstruction, and reconciliation.

The event is organized in partnership with Mayors for Peace Europe, the US Permanent Mission in Geneva, and the Cities of Remembrance network.

The event is in continuity with the previous <u>2022</u> and <u>2023</u> editions of the Urban Peace Dialogues at the Forum of Mayors.

#### **TENTATIVE PROGRAM**

As a side event to the 2024 Forum of Mayors, the event will be a **roundtable at the Palais des Nations**. The event will be streamed live and recorded for subsequent dissemination.

Place: Palais des Nations, Geneva

Panelists: Mayors and representatives from cities that sustained massive life losses and destruction in the past. A tentative list includes Dortmund, Dunkerque, Granollers, London, Marzabotto, Medellín, and Osijek.
