## Background



As the world continues to urbanize at an unprecedented rate, cities have become central to economic growth, cultural exchange, and social development. This rapid urbanization, however, also brings significant challenges, such as congestion, pollution, housing shortages, and unequal access to resources. Addressing these issues requires innovative and inclusive approaches to urban governance. Leadership at the city level, particularly by mayors, is crucial for shaping sustainable and resilient urban environments. Historically, leadership roles in cities have been predominantly occupied by men, reflecting broader gender disparities in political and executive positions globally.

According to the Sustainable Development Goals Report 2024 [1], parity in women's participation in public life remains elusive. At the current rate, achieving parity in management positions will take another 176 years. While women constitute over half of the global population, their representation in leadership positions within the world's cities is a mere 5% [2]. Addressing these disparities requires strong and sustained commitments to transforming biased social norms and repealing discriminatory laws. Prioritizing the enhancement of women's roles in leadership and decision-making, alongside significantly increasing investments in gender equality at national, regional, local and global scales, is essential.

The event "Woman and Mayor: Empowering Urban Leadership for Sustainable Futures" aims to shed light on the underrepresented perspectives of women in city leadership roles and their unique contributions to urban governance. The event seeks to explore how gender-balanced leadership enhances decision-making, promotes inclusivity, and contributes to more effective urban management, resulting in safer, more accessible, and sustainable cities. Through a roundtable discussion, women leaders will share their perspectives and experiences on how gender-sensitive leadership can lead to innovative solutions for urban challenges such as gender-based violence, access to education and healthcare, and sustainable urban planning. Looking to the future, the event will also discuss measures to foster a more inclusive political culture, ensuring the representation of women and gender minorities of all ages and abilities.
